William Arthurs

Funeral services for William Arthurs of Fayette, Mo., were held on March 31, 1960 at the Ralph A. Carr Funeral Chapel and interment was in the Fayette City cemetery. The Rev. Paul D. Walker conducted the rites.

The death of Mr. Arthurs occurred at his home at 206 Lake St., in Fayette at 6:24 o'clock Tuesday morning, March 29. For the last seven years he had suffered from a heart ailment but apparently had been in his usual health when he suffered a sudden heart attack which was fatal.

Born in Dubuque, Iowa, July 11, 1897, he was a son of Michael Arthur and Mary Hayburn Arthurs. Jan. 12, 1931, he was married to Dora Evans of Mellette, S. D., and she survives.

The family moved to Fayette from Mellette eight years ago last October and Mr. Arthurs was employed as a meat cutter at the Skillman grocery store until his health failed about seven years ago.

Surviving besides his wife are two daughters, Mrs. Marvin Flippin, Fayette, and Mrs. Ralph Welday, Columbia; three sisters, Mrs. Chris B. Rath, Leola, S. D., Mrs. Julian Erickson, Whitetail, Mont., and Mrs. William Fisher, Aberdeen, S. D., four brothers John Arthurs, who lives in the state of California, Joe Arthurs of Minnesota, James and Henry Arthurs of Mellette, and one grand-daughter Marcia Lee Flippin.

Mr. Arthurs was at one time a resident of this city when connected with the Anderson Meat Market.
