Mrs. J. H. Bade was born Ida Elizabeth Bernet on Nov. 25th, 1886, in the town of Alma, Wis. She was married to John Henry Bade on June 12, 1909, at the home of her parents in Tell, Wis., by the Rev. Heuser. To this union three children were born. They resided in Nelson, Wis., until 1932, when they moved to a farm near Stratford. In 1943, they retired and moved to Groton. On June 12, 1959, they celebrated their double golden wedding along with Mr. and Mrs. George Kaiser of Cochrane, Wis. All four were present at the reception at Groton.

Mrs. Bade passed away July 24th, 1961 at the age of 74 years. Survivors are her husband of Groton; one son, Oscar of Groton; two daughters, Mrs. Henry (Lila) Bartz, Groton, and Mrs. Wallace (Myrtle) McKiver of Stratford; six grandchildren; and four great-grandchildren. Also two brothers, Lloyd and Ray of Alma, Wis.; and two sisters, Mrs. George Kaiser of Cochrane, Wis., and Mrs. Selina Nelson of River Falls, Wis.

She was preceded in death by her parents, one sister, four brothers, and one grandchild. She was a member of the Presbyterian Church, the United Presbyterian Women and the Royal Neighbors Lodge.

Services were held on July 27th, at 2 o'clock in the Presbyterian Church in Groton with the Rev. Robert Carey officiating.
