John Henry Bade, 82, passed away Friday, Feb. 27th at Dakota Midland Hospital in Aberdeen. Services were held at 2:00 p. m., Monday, March 2nd, at the First Presbyterian Church in Groton with the Rev. Robert Carey officiating. Burial was in the Groton cemetery.
