Services for Albert Badten, 83, of 702 South Lincoln, Aberdeen, were held at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Aberdeen, with Monty Dell officiating. Burial was at Sunset Memorial Gardens.

He died Thursday, Nov. 26, 1987, at Aberdeen Nursing Center, Aberdeen.

Albert Badten was born August 13, 1904, to William and Johanna Badten in West Hanson township nine miles southwest of Groton. When he was six, his family moved into Groton where he attended Groton School.

On October 25, 1924, he married Amanda Krueger at Groton and then in 1935 they moved to Aberdeen. He worked in the Anderson Fuel Company office of 15 years.

He also worked for Gamble Farm Stores for three years. When the farm stores were sold, he was then em-

ployed by Hub City Feed & Seed Company. After two years, he started to work with the Aberdeen City Street Department as a truck driver and machine operator. In August 1965 he retired but kept active with farming interests.

He is survived by his wife; one daughter, Mrs. Dwaine (Belva) Shilman, Bismarck, N.D.; three grandchildren; and seven great-grandchildren.
