Herman Bartz

Services for Herman Otto Bartz, 77, of 710 N. Lincoln St., Aberdeen, were held at 2 p.m. Wednesday, July 18, at the Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Aberdeen. The Rev. Glenn Midthun officiated and burial was in Sunset Memorial Gardens.

Mr. Bartz was dead upon arrival at St. Luke's Hospital July 15.

Attending in a group were World War I veterans.

Music was provided by Bob Olson, soloist, who sang "Beyond the Sunset," and "How Great Thou Art," accompanied by Jude Borgensen. Pallbearers were Tony Crady, John Hoffer, Ronnie Job, William Ostberg, Perry Solberg and Cecil Streier.

Mr. Bartz was born Feb. 10, 1896, at Ferney and married Emma Aslakson at Webster April 28, 1922. The couple lived in Ferney until moving to Aberdeen in 1926. He was a disabled World War I veteran, a member of the Sidney L. Smith American Legion Post and of the Bethlehem Lutheran Church.
