Hazelle Black

The funeral for Hazelle Hosley Black, 76, rural Groton, was held at 2 p.m. Wednesday, May 16, at the First Presbyterian Church, Groton, with the Rev. James Wright officiating.

Burial was in the Groton Union Cemetery. The Paetznick-Garness Funeral Chapel, Groton, was in charge of arrangements.

She died Saturday, May 12, at St. Luke's Hospital, Aberdeen.

Casketbearers were Walter Albrecht, John Clark, Bob Jensen, Jay Swisher, Larry Pharis and Harry Pharis Jr. Mrs. Arliss Alberts was the organist and Diane Weishaar, soloist, sang "In The Garden" and "Savior, Again To Thy Dear Name We Raise".

Hazelle Hosley was born November 19, 1907, at Putney. She married William Black at Groton. She earned her teaching certificate from Northern State College, Aberdeen, and taught elementary and junior high school for 42 years. She taught at Putney, Plana, Daly Corners, Aberdeen, Groton, Waubay, Flandreau, Sisseton and Milbank.

She resided on the family farm near Putney most of her life. She was a member of the American Legion Auxiliary at Waubay, Order of the Eastern Star at Groton, Brown County Territorial Pioneers, Brown County Historical Society and Retired Teachers Association. She had also worked on the Brown County history book.

Survivors include one brother, Dale Hosley, Aberdeen; and a niece and nephew, Mrs. Denton (Gaylene) Haber of Sheldon, Iowa, and David Hosley, Groton.

She was preceded in death by one brother.
