

Pioneer Resident Laid To Rest Here Thurs., Sept. 2

Angeline Isabel Robinson, aged 80, former resident of Groton, ^{Blair} died at Alamo, Texas, on August 27, following a short illness and a surgical operation, and was buried at Groton on Thursday, Sept. 2.

Mrs. Blair, the daughter of James and Isabel Robinson, was born at Milwaukee, Wis., September 6, 1868. She was the widow of Thomas M. Blair and survived Mr. Blair by about nine months. She came to South Dakota to teach school prior to 1888 and in about that year she was married to Mr. Blair.

The Blairs, in their early married life, established themselves four miles northeast of Groton and there reared their family of four children: Frank, now residing at Virginia City, Mont.; Margie, who died in 1906; Ed of Groton, and Mrs. Jannie Beehner of Alamo, Texas. Also surviving are ten grandchildren and fourteen great grandchildren, and one sister, Mrs. Ed. LeBay, who resides in Aberdeen.

Mrs. Blair was of a retiring and kindly disposition and was well known and highly respected in this community.

Services were conducted by the Rev. L. C. Benson at the Paetznick Funeral Home. Interment was in the Groton Union Cemetery.
