## Mrs. Carrie Ranum Boe

Funeral services were held Wednesday, May 6, at the Evangelical Lutheran church in Langford for Mrs. Carrie Ranum Boe, who died at Claremont, May 3, 1953.

The Rev. S. W. Gulsvig officiated at the services. Special music was furnished by a vocal quartette: Mrs. Marvin Gullickson, Mrs. Jennings Tobin, Severin Olson and Hans Olson, who sang "Nearer, Still Nearer" and "Abide With Me." The Rev. Gulsvig sang "Den Store Vede Flok." Miss Martha Olson was the accompanist.

Pallbearers were Luther Gullickson, Eldred Fossel, Orville Kolbo, Homer Cutler, Nobel Rust and Theo. Rust. Interment was in the Langford cemetery.

Mrs. Carrie Ranum Boe was born July 12, 1860, at Ulnes Valdres, Norway. She came to America in 1879 and lived in Iowa, residing at the home of her brother, Jule Ranum, and in Winona, Minn., at the home of another brother, Knute Ranum.

Later she moved to Chicago, where on November 4, 1893, she was united in marriage to Jule S. Boe. The new home was established on the farm of the groom near Groton. Several years later the family moved to the present Boe farm, in Newport Township, Marshall County.

Mr. Boe died in 1924, and in 1925 Mrs. Boe left the farm to make her home with her daughter, Pearl, in Claremont. She was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith when a child in Norway. She had been a devout member of the Evangelical Lutheran church in Langford for over forty years.

She was preceded in death by her husband, an infant daughter, three sisters and four brothers. Left to mourn her passing are three children: Arthur of Mesa, Arizona; Pearl (Mrs. Henry Hinrichs) of Claremont; Roy, also of Claremont; one brother, Anners Ranum in Norway; five grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
