Fred Bomback Dies After Short Illness

Fred Bomback, a highly respected citizen of Groton, died in a Britton hospital, Tuesday afternoon at 5:30 after being confined there since May 17.

Mr. Bomback was taken to Britton on the above date suffering with ulcers of the stomach. An operation was performed and for a time it was thought that his condition was satisfactory, but later paralysis of the bowels set in, and he never recovered from the effects of the attack.

Mr. Bomback was born at Red Wing, Minn., October 11, 1879, and was married on Sept. 6, 1919 to Camille Kuehnert. His wife and a daughter, Mrs. Paul Stange, living south of Groton, survive him, coupled with two brothers and three sisters.

The funeral will be held Friday at St. John's Lutheran church at 1:30 p. m., preceded by a prayer service at the home at 1:15. They will be conducted by Rev. F. E. Wilke, who will have officiated both at the marriage and death of the deceased. Burial will be made in Groton cemetery, the upkeep of which place has been in charge of Mr. Bomback for the past several years.
