Henry Bonn Dies After A Lingerin*g* Illness

Henry Bonn, a highly respected and well-to-do farmer, living near Groton, died at his home Saturday evening after a lingering illness extending back for the past year or more.

He underwent an operation in a nearby hospital some time ago in the hopes of recovering his health, but complications set in which made his recovery doubtful for a time. Later he was discharged, and seemed to be slowly recovering under sun treatments, but cool days apparently shortened his life.

He was born at Potosi, Wis., May 7, 1876, and came to Dakota in 1900, settling at Parkston. He moved to Verdon in 1905, and came to Groton in 1916. He was married in 1896 to Miss Elizabeth Widman. Two children, Ethel and Albert, and three grandchildren survive him, together with his mother, five brothers and three sisters. Four of the brothers live in Groton vicinity and one at Plymouth, Wis. One of his sisters lives here and two in North Dakota.

The funeral was held Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock, conducted by Father Shanley, of the Andover Catholic church, and the remains were laid to rest in Groton cemetery.
