## HARRY M. BUCK

Funeral services were held Monday, April 13, 1953, at 2:00 p. m., at the Methodist church for Harry M. Buck, who passed away Friday morning, following a heart attack. The Rev. Harvey Sander was the officiant and songs were furnished by Misses Myrtle and Margaret Blader with Mrs. Sander at the organ. Burial was in the Groton cemetery. Pall bearers were B. C.
