Max E. Bulian

Funeral services for Max E. Bulian, 97, 313 7th Avenue S.W., Aberdeen, were held Monday, Nov. 14, at 10 a.m., at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Aberdeen with the Rev. R.A. Giese officiating. Burial was at Riverside Memorial Park. Mr. Bulian died on Wednesday, Nov. 9 at Aberdeen Nursing Center.

Mr. Bulian was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Aberdeen.

The casketbearers were Woodrow Jasmer, Edwin Mintz, Don Parsch, Gordon Campbell, Duwain Larson and Walter Rathke, all of Aberdeen. The honorary casketbearers were all those attending the service. The ushers were Howard Dahme and Ernest Angerhofer. The organist was Jude Borgesen and the soloist was David Sultz.

Max E. Bulian was born in Ram-pitz, Germany on August 24, 1886 to August and Johana Bulian. This is where he attended school. He came to the United States in 1902 and settled near Elgin, Ill. In 1906 he came to South Dakota and settled at Groton. In 1907 he moved to the James area. He was married to Rose A. Brill at James on October 20, 1908. They farmed in the James and Putney areas until 1939 when they moved to their farm southwest of Aberdeen. In 1942, they moved into Aberdeen where Mr. Bulian was employed by the Reese Elevator and later with the Farmers Lumber Company until he retired. Mrs. Bulian died on May 9, 1975.

Survivors include four sons, August Bulian of Aberdeen; Edward Bulian of Downey, Calif.; Harold Bulian of Rapid City; and Eugene Bulian of Yankton; two daughters, Mrs. Owen (Gertrude) Lee of Portland, Ore., and Mrs. Ford (Helen) Sheldon of Amarillo, Tex.; 19 grandchildren and 26 great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents, wife, two brothers and three sisters.
