## Dwight Campbell

Dwight Campbell, 76, a resident of Aberdeen for 52 years and an influential member of the state and American bar for most of that period, died last Monday. His home was at 1120 N. 1st St.

Judge Campbell, a former member of the South Dakota Supreme Court and later general solicitor in North and South Dakota, died at St. Luke's Hospital where he had been recovering from surgery.

He was born Nov. 5, 1887 at Orange City, Iowa. He graduated from Groton High School in 1902. He obtained his AB degree from Grinnell College and his LLB from Harvard. He was married in 1912 and came to Aberdeen to start law practice in the firm McNulty and Campbell.

Judge Campbell's service on the Supreme Court started in 1925 and continued until his resignation in 1937. At that time he returned to Aberdeen to the Milwaukee Road legal position.

He was the senior member of the law firm Campbell, Voas and Richardson. He was a 50-year member of the Aberdeen Masonic Lodge and a 32nd degree Mason in the Scottish Rite and a member of the Yelduz Temple.

Funeral services were held Wednesday, June 17th at the Baptist Church at 2 p. m. with the Rev. Harold Salem officiating. Burial was in the Groton Union Cemetery.
