Lyle Harvey Clocksene was born to Fred and Jennie Clocksene on May 12, 1904, at Groton. He was baptized into the Christian faith on July 18, 1904.

On October 26, 1932 he was united in marriage to Louise Ehrenberg. The couple engaged in farming, south of Groton, and in 1941, moved to their present farm, where they have since resided. Two children were born to this union.

Mr. Clocksene had been a patient at the Peabody Memorial hospital in Webster for two weeks, where he passed away Dec. 2, 1956, from acute leukemia.
