Wm. F. Curry died on Wednesday last out at Ed. Kranhold's. He was fifty-four years of age, had worked for different farmers in Henry for several years, and had come to the Kranhold farm only a day or two before. On Tuesday he seemed to be suffering with a severe cold, but in reality had an attack of pneumonia. He came to Groton that day where he procured some cough medicine. The next morning he didn't get up. He grew steadily worse and passed away during the forenoon. Very little is known of his antecedents save that he had been a soldier in the regular army, and had been honorably discharged. He had a brother at Minneapolis, who is a locomotive engineer. Being unable to communicate with relatives, the body was buried on Saturday evening, Rev. S. E. Brown conducting funeral service.
