Mrs. A. Clay Darling Dies In Hospital at Sioux City

Mrs. Sarah Notson Darling, 61, wife of the late A. Clay Darling of Parker, and former residents of Groton, died at St. Joseph's hospital in Sioux City, Iowa, Thursday. Funeral services were held at the grave in Riverside cemetery at Aberdeen, Saturday, with the Rev. F. G. MacKenzie of this city and Dr. H. G. Trost, of Aberdeen, officiating.

Mrs. Darling was the daughter of Dr. and Mrs. G. T. Notson. Dr. Notson was a Methodist minister in South Dakota for many years.

Sarah Notson was born at Sioux Falls. She was married to A. Clay Darling at Mitchell on October 21, 1911. She was a member of the Methodist church and the Eastern Star.
