Emil Dobberpuhl

Maj. Emil Dobberpuhl, 63, U. S. Air Force (ret.) died Tuesday, May 9, at a Jacksonville, Fla., hospital following a long illness.

Funeral services for Maj. Dobberpuhl, who lived at 6231 Brooks Circle N., Jacksonville, were held Thursday, May 11, in Hardage and Sons Southside Funeral Home.

Burial was in the Oaklawn Cemetery with Masonic rites.

Maj. Dobberpuhl had lived in Jacksonville for 12 years, moving there after retirement from the Air Force with 28 years of service.

A native of Ferney, S. D., he joined the military service after being graduated from high school. He worked his way up through the ranks to become an officer in the engineering branch. He served in World War II and the Korean conflict. He was regional inspector for Underwriters Laboratories for 10 years after retirement from military service in 1954.

He was a Lutheran and a member of the Bee Hive Lodge 184, F & AM, at Omaha, Neb., the Scottish Rite Guard Volley, Morocco Temple of the Shrine and the National Association of Legion of Honor, all of Jacksonville.

Survivors are his widow, one brother, Erwin of Boise, Ida., and several nieces and nephews.
