Services for Amos R. Doeringsfeld, 74, Groton, were held Saturday afternoon, Nov. 24, at the Groton Presbyterian Church with the Rev. Robert Carey officiating.

Burial was in the Groton Union Cemetery under the direction of the Paetznick-Garness Funeral Chapel.

He died November 21 at Dakota Midland Hospital in Aberdeen.
