BELOVED LADY DIES OF HEART TROUBLE

MRS. ERNEST DOERINGSFELD
DIES SUNDAY; FUNERAL
HELD WEDNESDAY

Mrs. Ernest Doeringsfeld, a greatly beloved lady of this city, closed a long life of usefulness to friend and family alike on Sunday and her gentle spirit was wafted away into the arms of her Master, whom she served so long while on earth. Mrs. Doeringsfeld's death came after two weeks of illness, the final cause being acute failure of the heart tissue. Before she was taken ill two weeks ago, she was her usual self, attending to her household duties and bringing cheer into sick homes of her neighbors.

Mrs. Doeringsfeld was 68 years of age on January 8. She was born in 1867 at Dakota, Waushara County, Wisconsin, and was married July 9, 1896 to her husband, the ceremony taking place at Gilmore City, Iowa. She was the mother of three children, one of whom preceded her in death.

Mr. and Mrs. Doeringsfeld came to Groton in 1907 and established their home on a farm near this city. About three or four years ago they moved to town and have since resided here.

Those who are left to mourn her loss are her husband and two sons, Amos and Olaf, together with four sisters and a grandson. The sisters are Mrs. G. A. Bethke, of Groton; Mrs. Albert Miller, Mrs. Anna Meinke and Miss Helen Daye, all of Westfield, Wis.

Mrs. Doeringsfeld became identified with the Evangelical church early in youth and throughout her long life was a faithful and consecrated member of this faith, taking part in all church activities and devoting considerable time and effort to its Sunday school and other organizations.

The funeral was held from the home on Wednesday afternoon at 2:00 o'clock, conducted by Rev. C.W.
