Agnes H. Dohman, 101, Mother Joseph Manor, Aberdeen, died Monday, May 9, 1994, at Mother Joseph Manor.

The Mass of Christian burial was Thursday, May 12, 1994 at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church, Groton, with the Rev. Albert Cizewski officiating. A scriptural wake service was held at the church, Wednesday evening.
