Mrs. Oscar (Katherine) Dombrowe, 85, of 1312 N. 3rd St., Aberdeen, and formerly of Claremont, died Friday, July 13, at the Colonial Manor, Groton.

The funeral was held at 10:30 a.m., Monday, July 16, at the United Methodist Church, Claremont, with the Rev. William Duncan officiating.

Burial was in the Huffton Cemetery. The Paetznick-Garness Funeral Chapel, Groton, was in charge of arrangements.

She was a member of the Brown County Territorial Pioneers and served on the Brown County Museum Board. She was active in the American Federation of Democratic Women and had served as a precinct committeewoman. She was also a member of the Order of the Eastern Star at Claremont.

Survivors include her husband, Aberdeen; one son, Marvin, Aberdeen; two sisters, Mrs. Mary Brooks, Groton; and Mrs. Donna Johnson, Sun City West, Ariz.; three grandchildren, four great-grandchildren and four step-grandchildren.
