Paul C. Dombrowe

Paul C. Dombrowe, 76, of 821 12th Ave. SE., died Thursday morning, Dec. 23 at the Aberdeen hospital.

Services were held at 1:30 a. m., Monday, Dec. 27 at the Huebl Funeral Chapel with Dr. J. Harley Thompson officiating. Burial was in Sunset Memorial Gardens.

Mr. Dombrowe was born Aug. 5, 1889 at Berlin, Germany, and came to the United States with his parents shortly afterwards. They settled in Neilsville, Wis. He and his brother, Oscar farmed for a time near Bismarck, N. D.

In 1917 he enlisted in the U. S. Army and saw service overseas. He received his honorable discharge in May, 1919 and returned to farming in the Claremont-Groton area. He married Agnes Hansen of Bonilla at Aberdeen on Sept. 1, 1925. They farmed near Claremont until 1949, when they moved to Aberdeen. He retired from active farming five years ago.

Survivors include his widow; no daughter, Mrs. William (Pauline) Gould, Claremont; two brothers, Rudolph, of Wausau, Wis., and Oscar of Claremont; three sisters, Mrs. Augusta Stack, Curtis, Wis.; Mrs. Louise Greisinger, Marshfield, Wis. and Mrs. Kenneth Ingersoll, Abbotsford, Wis.; and two grandsons. Two brothers and infant daughter preceded him in death.

He was a member of the Elks Lodge and Veteran of World War I.
