Obituary.

Miss Alma Draeger was born in James, S. D., Jan. 30, 1886. At the age of fifteen she taught school in this vicinity. She then studied stenography, after which she was employed for one year at Bowdle. She later made her home at Minnaeapolis for eleven years. In October, 1915 she left for California for her health. Here she lived until her death, Jan. 16, 1919. Her earthly remains were sent from California to Aberdeen and from there to James, Jan. 22. A short service was held the following day at the home of Mr. Otto Pasch, from where the body was taken to James Lutheran church. Rev. F. Wilke spoke on "The Merciful Kindness of the Lord, the Comfort of Christians in their afflictions." The body was then taken for burial to the James Lutheran cemetery. Many friends and relatives attended and numerous floral pieces showed esteem friendship.
