Funeral services were held Friday, at 2:00 p. m., at St. Paul's Lutheran church in Ferney, for Mrs. Fred Ehrenberg, 79, with the Rev. J. E. Schwarting officiating. A quartet composed of Mr. and Mrs. Orville Ott and Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd Pigors, accompanied by Joan Erdmann, sang, "My Jesus as Thou Wilt," and "Nearer My God to Thee." Mrs. Ehrenberg passed away Tuesday evening, March 8, 1955, at the Webster hospital, following a long illness.

Pauline Emilie Knuth was born on February 6, 1876, at Stolp, Pomerania, Germany. At the age of 12 years she came with her parents to America, locating near Andover. On December 19, 1898, she was united in marriage to Fred Ehrenberg of Ferney. After their marriage the couple located on a farm about three miles west of Andover. In the year 1901, they moved to a farm seven miles southeast of Groton, where she resided until her death. This couple was blessed with five children. One son, William, and her husband preceded her in death.
