W. C. EVANS, DECEASED

News came yesterday afternoon of the death of W. C. Evans, a pioneer resident near the county line southwest of Andover.

Mr. Evans had been suffering with typhoid fever for more than a month, and toward the end other complications arose which resulted fatally. His brother, Dr. W. J. Evans of Flandreau, was with him much of the time during the sickness, and with the widow and a son of the deceased, left last night for Hanover, Ohio, with the remains for interment.

Mr. Evans had just passed his fifty-second birthday. He had been a resident of this locality since the early days, and was counted among our thrifty, progressive farmers.

The stricken family will have the deep sympathy of old-time friends and neighbors. A widow, two sons and two daughters survive him.
