MRS. C. J. FALK GOES TO REWARD

DEATH FOLLOWS ILLNESS OF
MANY MONTHS—FUN-
ERAL THURSDAY

Mrs. C. J. Falk, a greatly beloved woman of East Riverside, slipped into her last long sleep at an Aberdeen hospital Saturday, following an illness of many months, which she bore with great fortitude and patience. Prior to the time Mrs. Falk was seized with this fatal illness she enjoyed the best of health, and rarely sought the counsel of medical authorities.

Mrs. Falk was born in Sweden, August 5, 1858, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Nels Daniels. She came to this country when 28 years of age. The family first went to Minneapolis, where she remained two years before coming to Groton. In December, 1889, she was united in marriage to Charles J. Falk, and to this union three were born: three sons, Walter Falk, of Dallas, Wis.; Harry Falk, of Stratford, and Christian Falk, of East Riverside. She leaves to mourn besides her husband and three sons, two brothers in Sweden; one sister, Mrs. Frank E. Falk, of Groton and three grand-children.

The body was brought to Groton, and funeral services will be held Thursday afternoon at 1:30 from the house and 2:30 from the Augustana Lutheran church, which religious faith she accepted early in life, and remained a constant and devoted member up to the time of her death. Rev. George Olson will officiate and burial will be made at the Evangelical Lutheran cemetery.

Mrs. Falk will be sadly missed by the community in which she labored and was loved for many years. Tireless in her devotion to friends and family, she was a woman whose personal contact with others developed abiding admiration and esteem for her in them. As acquaintance ripened into friendship, this admiration grew into a deep-seated affection and esteem which will be as lasting as time will permit.
