JACK FARQUHAR DIES

W. J. Rawson received a letter on Tuesday last, stating that Jack Farquhar had passed away at the State Soldiers Home, Hot Springs, which had been his abiding place for many years.

Mr. Farquhar was a member of the famous First Minnesota during the rebellion. He came to Groton and established the first livery stable during the early eighties, on the site occupied by the Bowles garage. He was mayor of Groton upwards of twenty years ago, and was well known here until advancing years caused him to quit business activity. His physical condition had been failing for some time, and he has finally answered the summons which none can evade.
