ESTEEMED LADY DIES SUDDENLY

MRS. H. E. FERRIS EXPIRES OF
HEART FAILURE ON
SATURDAY

Mrs. H. E. Ferris, a highly respected lady of Groton, died quite suddenly at her home here Saturday evening of heart failure. Mrs. Ferris had not been in the best of health for some time, but her condition was not considered serious. Saturday, shortly before her death, she seemed to be in exceptionally good spirits, visiting with her daughters in an energetic and entertaining way. Shortly after their departure for home, she was seized with an attack of heart failure, and expired suddenly.

Mrs. Ferris was a quiet and retiring lady, but she was well fortified with many lovable qualities, which endeared her to a host of friends throughout the city, particularly to a number of young men about Groton, who made their home with her for a number of years. To these she was then, and will always be affectionately known as a "mother."

Mrs. Ferris was born at Fon du Lac, Wis., on Feb. 27, 1859, and was married in 1883 to H. E. Ferris. To this union three children were born, Mrs. Arthur Krueger, Mrs. Earl Meredith and Mrs. John Hall, all of whom survive, together with one sister and her husband.

The funeral was held Tuesday at the home conducted by Rev. Norris, of the Methodist church, and the remains laid to rest in Groton cemetery.
