## Mrs. Mae Flanders

Mrs. Mae Flanders of Webster passed away at 6:00 o'clock, Tuesday morning, Aug. 14, at the Pea Memorial hospital after a two week illness. Cause of death was a heart ailment. She had reached the age of 77 years and six months.

Funeral services were held at 9:00 a.m. Tuesday morning at St. Otto's Catholic church in Webster with Rev. J. J. Quinn officiating.

Interment was made in the family plot at All Saints cemetery at Andover. Survivors are Dale Phillips, Milo Phillips, Lloyd Blair, Richard Tamlyn, Ward Flanders and Ward Flanders.

Charlotte Flanders, the daughter of James Gorman and Catherine Gorman, was born Jan. 27, 1878 at Lowville, Wis. Here she remained until 1886 when she moved with her parents to Andover. She attended local schools and later taught in the community.

In 1911 she was married to Earl Flanders at Andover. One son was born in this union. The marriage was dissolved and in 1918 she was married to Archie S. Flanders at Andover.

They resided on a farm near Andover until 1935, when they moved to Watertown, Mr. Flanders being employed by the State Department.

After they moved to Wilmot, Mr. Flanders passed away. Mrs. Flanders then moved to Webster where she had since resided. She was employed as office clerk at the Webster post office until the time of her death.

Mrs. Flanders was a faithful member of the Catholic church and a member of St. Otto's Altar Society.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Archie S. Flanders, who died in 1945.
