FRIDLY FUNERAL SATURDAY

Paul and Albert Fridly Laid to Rest in Groton Cemetery.

Funeral services for Paul and Albert Fridly occurred at the family residence, west of Groton, Saturday morning. The bodies, which were brought back by their father, Albert Fridly, Sr., arrived in Putney Friday morning and were brought to the family home from there overland.

The funeral was conducted by Rev. Taggart of the Groton Presbyterian church, and was well attended. Many beautiful floral offerings, bearing mute evidence of the sympathy of the donors to the family, had been made and decorated the caskets at the home. The words of Rev. Taggart were very well chosen and bore much of comfort to the family in their great misfortune.

The bodies were followed to the grave by a large number of automobiles, and they were laid to rest in a double grave which had been prepared.

The sympathy of the entire community goes out to the family in their great loss. Not much in addition to the facts which were printed in this paper of a week ago was learned with reference to just what happened in connection with the taking away of the boys. There seems to be little doubt but that the younger son was insane at the time of the commission of his rash act.
