Services for Frank Fryer, 46, were held at 2:00 p. m., Friday, Sept. 27, at the First Lutheran Church in Britton. He was killed in a car-truck collision near Selby, Monday.

The Rev. Don Gaarder officiated and burial was in the Britton cemetery.

Mr. Fryer was born near Britton, July 6, 1922 and lived in the Britton area much of his life. He had also lived in Whitewood for six years, at Sisseton and for the last year, here in Groton, where he was employed as a truck driver for Siefkes Truck Line. He was a veteran of World War II, a member of the American Legion at Andover and the VFW at Aberdeen.
