Interment services were held at the local cemetery Saturday, for Mrs. A. P. Fuller, a former resident of this city, with Father E. J. Coyne officiating. Funeral services had been held earlier that day at the Holy Family Catholic church in Mitchell under direction of Monsignor Brady. Mrs. Fuller passed away Jan. 10th at a Mitchell hospital.

Eva May Mick was born July 24, 1874, to John and Appolona Mick. To this union were born two sons and five daughters, Nicholas, John, Elizabeth, Susan, Eva, Mary and Appolona.

The deceased was united in marriage to A. P. Fuller in 1908, and to this union one daughter and five sons were born. All died in infancy excepting a son, Charles, who lost his life at Dutch Harbor, Alaska, Nov. 19, 1942.

Mr. and Mrs. Fuller made Groton their home while the husband was in the implement business. Upon their change of residence in 1937, they went to Oregon, where they spent about eight years, then returning to Mitchell in 1945, where they resided during the past 12 years.

Mrs. Fuller was a graduate nurse of Anker hospital, St. Paul, and served as an army nurse during World War I, and was a life-long member of the Altar Society, both in South Dakota and Oregon. She was a kind and devoted wife and mother and her outstanding personality won her the friendship of a host of friends, who deeply regret her departure.
