

Lloyd Gayman

- Ellendale, ND-Funeral service for Lloyd Gayman, 96, and 8 days from his 97th birthday will be 10:00 am, Monday, September 18, 2006 at Presbyterian United Methodist Church at Ellendale. The Rev. Joseph Manja will officiate.

(Roggenkamp) Gayman was born September 22, 1909 on the family homestead in Van Meter Township southeast of Ellendale. He started his education in Windship, ND then Van Meter 1 School and continued on at Ellendale Normal and Industrial for high school and college. He received his teaching certificate and returned soon after to complete his Bachelors of Science degree in Industrial Arts in 1933. He taught school in Gackle, near Forbes, three years in New Castle, Wyoming and then moved to Brewster, Ohio where he taught high school and worked for the Wheeling Lake Erie Railroad as a draftsman at the same time.

- He was united in marriage to Aune Kotila on November 19, 1941 at Chicago, Illinois. Due to a respiratory ailment, they relocated to Nogales, Arizona where he continued to teach for ten years. They relocated to Coalinga, California where he taught for nearly 30 years, retiring from education in 1977. Throughout Lloyd's working career, he returned to college many times to further his education. Lloyd and Aune made trips back to the Ellendale and Frederick area nearly every summer. They also traveled extensively having covered all of North America, Hawaii, U.S. Virgin Islands and a tour of Europe that included Finland.

- Lloyd had many interests that included lapidary (collecting and polishing of stones), genealogy and photography. Throughout Lloyd's working career, he had many part-time endeavors, some of which were building and remodeling of many homes, working as a surveyor, being a house inspector for the VA/FHA and has a bus driver at Glacier National Park. His wife died July 15, 1998. Lloyd made his home in Ellendale since her death.

- He was a member of Presbyterian United Methodist Church. He was a past member of NEA, Arizona State Board of Teachers; he had been active in the California Teachers Association and was past president of ATA.
