GROTON - The funeral for Clarence Georgens, 80, Groton, was held Wednesday at St. John's Lutheran Church in Groton with the Rev. Dan Elkins officiating.

Burial was in Groton Union Cemetery under the direction of Paetznick-Garner Funeral Chapel.

He died Sunday, Jan. 15, 1989, at St. Luke's Midland Regional Medical Center in Aberdeen.

Clarence Georgens was born February 1, 1908, in Potosi, Wis., to Joseph and Mattie (Bradley) Georgens. At age 2, he moved to Randolph. He later lived in the Groton and Verdon areas. He owned and operated a dray service.

He married Margaret Meyers in Stratford in 1929. His wife died in 1933. He married Dolores Kuhfeld in Aberdeen September 14, 1938.
