## Jennie B. Grinolds

Funeral services for Jennie B. Grinolds were held Thursday at 2:00 p. m. at the Paetznick Funeral Home, with the Rev. Harvey Sander officiating. Burial was in the family lot in Riverside cemetery in Aberdeen. Mrs. Grinolds passed away at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Marion Hume in Portland, Ore., on July 17, following a lingering illness and stroke. Services were also held earlier at Portland.

Jennie Eppard was born June 2, 1868, in the state of Iowa, coming to South Dakota in a covered wagon with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Eppard, when 13 years of age. They settled on a homestead three miles southwest of Groton, however, the town was not in existence there until about a year later. She attended the first school in Groton and upon graduating taught school for six years in the Ferney vicinity.

In 1899 she married Wm. Grinolds, also a pioneer of the Ferney vicinity. They resided and reared their family on the Grinolds farm, southwest of Ferney, except for a few years, when they made their home in Groton and Aberdeen. In 1934 they moved to Portland, Ore., where Mr. Grinolds passed away in 1935.

Seven children were born to this union, two passing away in infancy. Also Stephen at the age of 14 years and Mack, who will be well remembered, as he lived most of his life in this area. Surviving are two daughters, Mrs. Marion Hume and Mrs. Atha Peterson; one son, John, all residing in Portland. Besides her children there are three sisters, two brothers, four grand children and six great grand children.

Although it has been a number of years since Mrs. Grinolds left this community for a new home in Oregon, she leaves a large circle of friends here, who extend sympathy to her loved ones in their bereavement.
