## MRS. H. D. HALL DIES; RITES AT YORK, NEB.

Many citizens of the Groton community will learn with much regret of the death of Mrs. H. D. Hall, of York, Neb. She had been in failing health for two years and died on July 23, surrounded by the entire family except one daughter, who preceded her in death.

Mrs. Hall had a considerable acquaintance in the Groton community, having visited here often with her sons, John and Randall, and her daughter, Mrs. H. W. Jones. Besides the children who reside in this community she is survived by two daughters, four in-laws, eight grandchildren and her husband, Harris D. Hall, with whom she had spent more than 58 years of wedded life.

Mrs. Hall was a covered-wagon pioneer of Nebraska, having come with her parents from Freeborn County, Minnesota, her birthplace, in 1873. She was greatly beloved by her family and a host of friends. In commenting upon her death a York, Neb., paper says: "She will be missed for she has helped make the world a better place in which to live during her life."
