Funeral services were held at 2 p. m., July 16 at the Butler Lutheran Church for Mrs. Alfred Halverson, who passed away July 13 at the Day County Hospital. Pastors A. P. Nelson and E. J. Upon completion of her training at normal schools in Madison, S. D., and Madison, Minn., she taught public and parochial school for several years. She taught Sunday school most of her life.

On Nov. 20, 1918 she was united in marriage to Alfred Halverson of Constance, Minn. They were engaged in the merchandise business for 30 years.

In 1944 she founded and operated the first University of Minnesota International Student House at 406-11th Ave. SE., Minneapolis. Her life long interest in foreign missions was manifest in her personal contact with the University students from all over the world. After retiring she and her husband had made their home at Butler.
