Harvey Hannon

- Harvey Hannon, 71, of Conde, died September 26, 2002, at his residence. His funeral will be held Tuesday, Oct. 1, 10:30 a.m., at the United Methodist Church, Andover, with the Rev. Grant Piehl officiating. Burial will be at the Conde City Cemetery under the direction of Paetznick-Garness Funeral Chapel, Groton. Military Rites will be provided by Andover Legion Post #258.

- Visitation will be at the funeral chapel in Groton from 2 p.m. to 8 p.m. on Monday, Sept. 30. A prayer service will begin at 7 p.m. with Masonic Rites to follow. There will also be an hour of visitation prior to the service at the church in Andover.

- Harvey Hall Hannon was born on September 24, 1931 at Hallwood farm in Andover to James and Elsie (Hall) Hannon. He grew up and received his first years of educa

tion in country school Bluebird #162. He attended Andover High School and graduated in 1949.

- Harvey farmed for several years after school and entered the Army in 1953, serving in Korea. After an honorable discharge from the Army he returned home to farm with his uncles and brother on the family farm south of Andover. Harvey married Donna Schimmel-Cowan on April 30th, 1966. They made their home in the Conde area, until the time of Harvey's death.

- Harvey was a member of the Andover Methodist Church and of the Andover Corinthian Lodge, where he served twenty-five years as secretary. He enjoyed spending time visiting with family, friends and neighbors and listening to polka music. He also enjoyed pheasant hunting and deer hunting. He was an exceptional marksman.

- Survivors include his wife of Conde, three daughters, Kori (Tim) Nitchen of West Pueblo, Colo.; Kelli (Rick) Schultz of Sherrill, Iowa; Lori (Gary) Sombke of Sisseton; one son, Larry (JoAnn) Cowan of Sedona, Ariz.; one brother, Clarence (Ida) Hannon of Andover and nine grandchildren.
