### OBITUARY

After attending services in James, Sunday, Sept. 20 and shortly after she returned home, Mrs. H. Heberer, one of James' finest Christian characters, had a stroke of apoplexy. She passed away a little after 8:00 that evening.

Henriette Voigt Heberer was born at Lebanon, Wis., on July 31, 1861, and spent the early years of her life in the state of Wisconsin. During the year 1882 she came to South Dakota and filed upon a homestead near what is now the town of James, and continued to reside upon that land with her parents until her marriage to Mr. Henry Heberer, who was "homesteading" adjoining land.

They were married in Brown county on the 3rd day of December, 1889, and lived together in happiness and contentment until the time of her death, reaching the age of 64 years, 1 month and 20 days.

She is survived by her bereaved husband, two sons, John and Edward, her daughter-in-law, Mrs. Myrtle Heberer, and many nieces and nephews; also two sisters and one brother. They are Mrs. Henry Lehman, of Juneau, Wis... Emelie Voigt of Los Angeles, Cal., and John Voigt of Seattle, Wash.
