Harvey Henderson

Funeral services for Harvey E. Henderson, 77, of 4518, 6th Ave., Tacoma, Wash. 98406, were held in the Garden Chapel Mountain View Funeral Home Monday, Jan. 18, at 3:00 p.m. Dr. Michael Anderson officiated. Burial was in the Mountain View Memorial Park.

Harry Aldrich, solist, sang "Rock of Ages" and "Nearer My God To Thee," accompanied by Mrs. Maurice Owens, organist.

Mr. Henderson was born in Neillsville, Wis., Jan. 17, 1893. He came to South Dakota as a boy with his parents and settled on a farm near Groton. On June 1, 1916 he married Pauline Gibbs in Aberdeen, and moved to Dupree S. D., where he was engaged in farming. In 1922 he moved back to Groton where he was employed by the City of Groton as night policeman for 16 years.

During World War II, the family moved to Tacoma, Wash., where he was employed in the Bremerton Navy Yards as a pipefitter until his retirement 12 years ago.

Mr. Henderson had been in poor health for the past four years. On Dec. 31, 1970, he suffered a cerebral hemorrhage and entered Doctors' Hospital. He passed away January 14, 1971 of pneumonia at the hospital.

He is survived by his wife Pauline, Tacoma; two sons, Ivan of Seattle, Wash., Milton of Tacoma; two daughters, Mrs. Ellsworth (Alveretta) Face, Tacoma and Mrs. Marvin (Mildred) Erdmann of Groton; seven grandchildren and fifteen great grandchildren.
