Funeral services were held Thursday, Jan. 17, at 1:30 p. m., at First English Lutheran church in Groton for Mrs Anna Herron, who passed away at her Aberdeen home on Jan. 14, following a short illness. The Rev. George Anderson officiated. James Julson was soloist, accompanied by Mrs. H. W. Iverson. Burial was in the Groton cemetery.

Anna R. Larson was born in Flikkesfjord, Norway, March 12, 1859. She came to the United States at the age of 20 years and was married to Joseph M. Herron of Viroqua, Wis., in 1882. Grandmother Herron was a very loving and devoted wife and mother. Her christian spirit, her outstanding personality and general outlook of life, known to all who knew her, will be a lasting memory of their departed relative and friend.
