Fred L. Hintz

Fred L. Hintz, 60, rural Jamestown, N. D., farmer died Sunday night, June 4, en route to the hospital after suffering a heart attack at his home.

He was born in West Hanson township, Brown County, April 23, 1907, to Mr. and Mrs. Emil Hintz. In the fall of 1913, he moved to North Dakota with his parents, who settled at Windsor. He attended school here and at Jamestown high school. He later farmed with his father and brothers. In 1937, he moved to Midway township and had lived at the present farmsite, three miles north of Jamestown, since 1943. He never married. He lived one year with his uncle, Fred Schlichting and attended school in West Hanson. Mr. Hintz served in the army in World War II. He was a member of Our Saviors Lutheran Church.

Surviving are four brothers, Edward, Arthur, Oscar and Clarence Hintz, all at home and one sister, Mrs. Lloyd (Loretta) Kiner, Windsor, N. D. He was preceded in death by his parents and a brother.

Funeral services were held Thursday, June 8 at Our Saviors Lutheran Church with Rev. H. Rutz officiating. Burial was in Sunset Memorial Gardens, Jamestown.
