Hattie Hoeft

Funeral services for Hattie G. Hoeft, 75, Stratford, were held on Tuesday, March 26, 1985 at 10 a.m. at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Stratford, with The Rev. William Paepke officiating. Burial followed at Riverside Memorial Park in Aberdeen. Mrs. Hoeft died on Saturday, March 23, 1985 at the Colonial Manor of Groton.

The honorary and active pallbearers were all grandsons. Ushers were Dick Rossow and Jerry Schley. The organist was Beverly McNeil, with special singing by the congregation and a duet by David Suelz and Donna Markley-Picht.

Hattie G. Adler was born on March 12, 1910 in Henry Township, at James, to William and Otilia Dally Adler. This is where she attended country school through eighth grade, then went to high school one year in Aberdeen and one year in Groton. She was married to Henry J. Hoeft at Ipswich on June 10, 1927. They made their home on a farm south of Stratford until 1942, when they moved into Stratford. In Fall, 1951, they moved to a farm two miles north of Stratford, where she lived until 1979, when she moved back into Stratford, residing in town until the present time, except for a brief stay at the nursing home at Groton. Her husband preceded her in death on October 18, 1960.

She was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Stratford and a lifetime member of the ladies aid.

She is survived by four sons, Leonard, Colorado Springs, Colo.; Harwood, Walnut Creek, Calif.; Allen, Stratford; Henry J.
