Funeral services were held Sunday, Sept. 30, from Zion Evangelical church at LeSueur, Minn., for Albert Carl Hornaman, 64 who passed away Sept. 26, as a result of a stroke suffered a week previous. Yaeger (Lorene), Mrs. Arnold Brenke (Delores), Albert, Jr., and Melford, all of LeSueur, and Mrs. Gordon Hahn (Evelyn) of St. Peter. All are married.

Mrs. Hornaman passed away Oct. 16, 1933. In 1935, Mr. Hornaman and children moved from this vicinity to a farm in Henderson township in Minnesota, where they farmed five years. The deceased joined the Green Giant Company in 1940, where he was employed continuously since.
