Funeral Services Held For Pioneer Resident Saturday

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon at the Presbyterian church for Mrs. Wm. Hosley of Putney, with the Rev. H. W. Atkinson officiating.

A quartet composed of Mesdames Alfred Paetznick, Amos Doeringsfeld, Palmer Peterson and Otho Rix, sang three songs. They were accompanied by Mrs. Joe Williams.

Johanna Marie Carlson was born at Grantsburg, Wis., February 22, 1878. When she was three years old her parents moved to Waubay, S. D., where they were early pioneers, living on a farm west of that city.

In 1906 she was united in marriage to Wm. Hosley of Putney and lived on their farm home until Saturday morning, a week ago, when she was taken ill with a stroke. Death came to Mrs. Hosley early Tuesday evening, Dec. 30, at St. Luke's hospital in Aberdeen.

Mrs. Hosley was a member of the Christian Science church of Aberdeen.

Her parents, the late John Carlsons', three brothers and one sister preceded her in death.

The departed leaves to mourn, her husband, two sons, Willis and Dale, of Putney, and one daughter, Mrs. Wm. Black of Waubay.
