Lyle Dean Ives, 63, Pendleton, Ore., and formerly of the Andover, Groton and Aberdeen areas died Tuesday, Sept. 29, 1987, in Pendleton.

There was a memorial service at 10 a.m. Thursday, Oct. 1 at the First Presbyterian Church, Pendleton. Bishop Funeral Chapel of Pendleton was in charge of the arrangements.

A local memorial service was held at 10 a.m. Monday, Oct. 5 at the First Presbyterian Church of Groton with the Rev. Dick Geiger officiating. Inurnment was in the Groton Union Cemetery. Pactznick-Garness Funeral Chapel of Groton was in charge of local arrangements.

Lyle Dean Ives was born November 27, 1923 to Harry and Jane E. Ahern Ives at Andover. He graduated from Andover High School in 1941. He served in the United States Air Force in World War II in the European theatre. During his tour of service he flew on 72 missions over France, Rome-Arno, and Yugoslavia. He received the air medal,

two silver oak leaf clusters, two bronze oak leaf clusters, and the distinguished unit badge.

He married Jean E. Pratt on April 18, 1945, at Groton. While working for John Morrell and Company for 32 years they lived in Aberdeen; Spokane, Wash.; Omaha, Neb.; Great Falls, Mont.; Las Vegas, Nev.; and Missoula, Mont. For the past six years he and his wife have owned and operated Jean's Hallmark card store in Pendleton, Ore.

He was a member of the First Presbyterian Church, Elks Lodge No. 288, the Pendleton Chamber of Commerce, and the Pendleton Retail Association.

Preceding him in death were his parents, one brother, Howard; one sister, Lois Mickelson and a infant daughter Patricia.

He is survived by his wife, Jean, Pendleton; one son, Richard Lee, Seattle, Wash.; one daughter, Barbara Kaye Low, Spokane, Wash.; one granddaughter, Shawn and one sister, Mrs. Erwin (Hazel) Hite of Conde.
