Services for Ingvald C. Jacobson, 63, Groton, were held at the United Methodist Church at 2 p.m., Friday, June 7, with the Rev. Larry Moore officiating. Burial was in Sunset Memorial Gardens.

Mr. Jacobson was pronounced dead on arrival at St. Luke's Hospital Tuesday.
