## MRS. ANNA JENSEN GOES TO BEYOND

ANOTHER PIONEER LADY ANSWERS  
LAST CALL FRIDAY,  
JULY SIXTEENTH

Mrs. Anna Jensen, an esteemed lady of this city died at her home here last Friday from the effects of paralysis. She had been ill only ten days prior to her death.

Mrs. Jensen is another one of the early pioneers to enter upon the last long sleep. She was born at Watertown, Wis., June 6, 1870, and came to South Dakota in 1883, and with her parents settled upon land four miles southwest of Ferney. She married in 1888 to Christ Jensen and to this union one child was born, Herman, who survives her. She moved to Groton in 1920 and has made this city her home since that time.

Those left to survive her are: One son, Herman, of Groton; two brothers, August Bartz, of Ferney, and Otto Bartz of Stratford; three sisters, Mrs. Ida Schinkel, of Groton; Mrs. Phillip Radke of Stratford, and Mrs. John Radke of Groton.

The funeral was held from St. John's Lutheran church Tuesday afternoon at 2:00 o'clock, and the remains were laid to rest in Groton cemetery. Rev. F. E. Wilke conducted the obsequies.

Mrs. Jensen was a lady greatly beloved by a host of friends and she will be sadly missed, not only from their circle, but also the church, she being a life-long member of the Lutheran congregation.
