DEATH OF EDITH JOHNSON

Commissioner L. J. Johnson went to Minneapolis Monday night in response to a telegram regarding his daughter, who has been suffering with infantile paralysis, for several months.

Word was received yesterday that the young lady had died. Mr. Johnson brought home the body via Claremont today.

As we go to press the time of the funeral has not been announced, as Mr. Johnson is waiting word from his son Arthur, who is in Montana.

Miss Edith Johnson was born in Riverside Township December 21st, twenty-five years ago. She passed through the schools and entered the Northern Normal, at Aberdeen, being one of the first graduates from that institution.

She spent some time as a successful teacher, and later took land in Montana, and was living in that state when taken ill about August first. Taken to Minneapolis a stubborn fight was made against the disease, but on Sunday last she was stricken with pneumonia, dying yesterday morning.

People of the whole community in which Miss Edith grew to womanhood, will deeply mourn the untimely death, and extend sympathy to the stricken family.
