Services for Mrs. Rose Kellison, 74, of Groton were held Wednesday, Jan. 23, at St. John's Lutheran Church in Groton with the Rev. Monte Gusewelle officiating.

She worked as a dietitian and kitchen supervisor at the South Dakota School for the Visually Handicapped in Aberdeen and for the Groton Schools. She lived in the Ferney-Groton area most of her life except from 1940 to 1951 when she lived in Bozeman. She was a member of the Groton Senior Citizens and the Colonial Manor Volunteers.

Survivors include one son, Jack, of Sioux Falls; one brother, Herman Schinkel, of Ferney; two sisters, Mrs. Bertha Bradshaw, of Portland, Ore.; and Mrs. Minnie Neldon of Groton; and two grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her husband, one brother, and one sister.
